

## Royal Wulff



### Materials

Hook	3xl Nymph Hook 12-16 (light wire)
Thread	Black 6/0
Wing	White Calf Tail
Tail	Moose Body Hair
Body	Peacock Herl
Body	Red Floss
Wing	Brown Dry Fly Hackle sized for fly

Start the thread  $\frac{1}{3}$  of the hook shank length behind the eye and wrap a base of thread to the bend of the hook. Prepare and stack a bundle of white calf tail. Tie in the calf tail with the tips extending out over the eye the length being about the gape of the hook. Cut the butts of the calf tail at an angle towards the bend and bind down. Put thread wraps in front of the calf tail to stand them up and divide calf tail into equal sections. Prepare and stack a bundle of moose body hair, tail length should be the gape of the hook and tie in at the hook bend. Cut the butts of the moose hair at an angle toward the eye to mate with the wing butts and bind down. Wind the thread to the tie in point of the tail. Tie in 3 or 4 peacock herls by the trimmed tips. Wind the thread forward to  $\frac{1}{4}$  of the way to the **wing** (not the eye) and wrap the peacock herl to that point and tie off. Bind the peacock forward another  $\frac{1}{4}$  of the way (Do not cut off the herl). Tie in a piece of red floss and wrap back to the peacock herl and forward. Tie off the floss and trim the excess. Wind the thread forward another  $\frac{1}{4}$  and wrap the peacock herl to that point, tie off and trim the excess. Prepare a brown dry fly hackle by stripping the fluff off the base of the stem. Tie in the hackle by the bare stem with the dull (concave) side of the feather facing you and bind down toward the eye. Wrap the hackle behind the calf tail and then in front of the calf tail. Tie off the hackle and wrap a small head and finish with half hitches or a whip finish. Apply a small amount of head cement.
